# 1. Mayor's Introduction and Thankyou

I am extremely proud of the way our people and agencies have worked together to ensure the needs of all in our communities were met during the Covid-19 lockdown in both Alert Level 4 and 3.

A special thanks to both our iwi Rangitane o Tamaki nui a Rua and Ngati Kahungunu o Tamaki nui a Rua for the outstanding resource, care and commitment to looking after our people. The team here at council have worked extremely hard through three crisis' almost simultaneously with our towns water shortage, declared drought and Covid-19.

We have used many of our existing networks and relationships and formed new ones which will strengthen us further. One of the most challenging aspects for me during lockdown was knowing how brown and dry we were at lockdown, having rain but being unable to visually see how that was making a difference in our rural communities. As mayor, it is tough to know your district is hurting and be operating in a reduced capacity to assist. Thank you to the Rural Support Trust and Federated Farmers for working strongly with council in supporting our farmers.

Whilst managing two crisis together, we also had a recovery team dedicated to our way forward. #LoveLocalTararua was launched and has been well received to support our businesses and wider economy.

It has been wonderful to enjoy seeing people again. We acknowledge that many are experiencing increased anxiety, lonliness, stress and hardship and we are re-considering our Annual Plan and rates increase, looking for ways we can assist. A special thanks to the team here at council that worked through Alert Level 4 to provide the essential services to keep the Tararua District running and safe. I would also like to acknowledge and thank their families as it was a stressful time knowing your loved one was potentially putting themselves at risk daily.

Thank you to all our essential workers throughout the Tararua District that made such a difference in our lives. There are too many local heroes to name individually but some of these stories should be acknowledged and shared because they are stories of humanity and the reason Tararua and New Zealand have done so well in our fight against Covid-19.

There may be a few mayoral high teas around Tararua to say thank you.

## COVID-19

April 29 was the first Council Meeting held electronically via ZOOM conference and because of COVID-19 we have been forced to embrace more technology than ever before.

It has reinforced the challenges faced rurally, working from home with other family members all requiring internet at the same time.

But, while my coverage is not perfect, it is more than many others have in our rural areas. We were not without connection issues at our first virtual council meeting either and this was experienced in our towns too.

We are moving in the right direction and I am pleased to see Chorus back working, installing fibre in Dannevirke starting under Alert Level 3. Once Dannevirke is complete, they will move to Woodville, Pahiatua and Eketahuna – it is coming.



Connect Tararua worked with local communities, identified potential tower sites, understanding the extent of the issues and all this work has been used to influence better connectivity outcomes for the district. We are expecting work to start on the towers this year in Herbertville, Ahiweka, Kumeroa, Mangamaire, Nireaha, Pongaroa and Rongomai, as part of the Rural Broadband Initiative 2 rollout which is considerably more than the one tower announced initially.

I am proud of our district's response, sense of coming together and community spirit to help in the fight against the virus. As we all enjoy the freedom that Alert level 2 brings, it is important to stay vigilant and well-practiced in simple measures such as thorough hand washing and appropriate social distancing.

As the community members of our district travel and receive visitors we all need to keep working together to maintain the low COVID-19 cases seen in recent weeks. It is now up to each and every one of us to maintain the low numbers of cases we have seen in recent weeks.

## 3. Regional Economic Recovery Taskforce

I am working as part of the Regional Economic Recovery Taskforce which is a role I considered very seriously before agreeing. My priority will always be to our people and our district and I understand how crucial our own recovery plan is, but we also need to play our part regionally, especially with the opportunities the Manawatu Tararua Highway offers.

The taskforce consists of iwi, business, local and central government leaders, and economic development agency representatives and will build on the work already achieved under Accelerate25, Te Pae Tawhiti, and the Manawatū-Whanganui Civil Defence Emergency Management Group.

The critical impacts from Covid-19 will predominately be social and economic, however opportunities for stimulating recovery also extend to the built and natural environment, rural areas and cultural wellbeing.

As well as delivering a regional economic recovery plan, the taskforce will act as a key channel for interaction with central government, identifying and pursuing opportunities to strengthen and build our region's economy.

I have always aspired for Tararua to be collaborative, working together locally, regionally and nationally to achieve the greatest outcomes for us. Being part of this taskforce is not something I have taken lightly or could possibly take part in without the full confidence in our team of councillors and staff at the Tararua District.

We also connect with the Wairarapa Economic Development Strategy and understand what is planned and how we can both work together and leverage the opportunities which arise here.

We are fortunate to sit between the Hawke's Bay, Manawatū and Wairarapa regions. Tararua connects them all and understanding each is important for our growth and prosperity. We are in the middle of everywhere. We can be proud of the enormous effort being contributed by the team here at council working for us in our recovery.

Whakahoutia Tararua - we will flourish again.

# 5. Te Āpiti Manawatū Gorge Governance Group

The Te Āpiti Manawatū Gorge Governance Group met on the 5 May 2020 via ZOOM.

The Manawatū Gorge project has been operating since 2006 and since then formed the Te Āpiti Manawatū Gorge Governance Group.

This governance group involves Horizons Regional Council, Department of Conservation, Palmerston North City Council, Tararua District Council, Manawatū District Council, Kiwirail, tangata whenua and neighbouring landowners.

The Terms of Reference for the Governance Group were revisited and the four pillars of the project; recreation, biodiversity, culture and education were re-visited in detail.


The Group also discussed a final report from Central Economic Development Agency: Te Āpiti Tourism Potential which investigates the potential to transform Te Āpiti Manawatū Gorge into a major tourism destination, offering high quality visitor experiences. Some of

the tourism opportunities explored in the report included Māori cultural tourism and ecotourism, agricultural tourism, active and adventure tourism, utilisation of old gorge road sections and other experiences such as utilising the railway line.

I am excited to see what the future holds for our district and I am grateful for the abundance of opportunity around us.

## 6. Provincial Growth Funding - Pūkaha

Regional Economic Development Minister, Shane Jones, announced in May the investment of \$2.5 million from the Provincial Growth Fund to expand and develop Pūkaha National Wildlife Centre.

I attended a meeting with Pukaha Manager, Emily Court, to discuss the development of the centre and they are committed to supporting local contractors and people which is great.

The successful wildlife centre, captive breeding facility and over 1000 ha of native forest was recently returned to Rangitāne o Tararua and Rangitāne o Wairarapa in February and Deputy Mayor Erana Peeti-Webber and I were lucky enough to be invited to this momentous celebration.

It is exciting to see such a fabulous asset in our district being celebrated and able to realise its potential.

With the expansion of Pūkaha's education program and facilities, accommodation and a nocturnal boardwalk, it will help boost our local economy through development and attract even more tourists to our district. I look forward to staying overnight at Pūkaha, enjoying an overnight tour and promoting #LoveLocal Tararua.


