3 – Ruahine Ramblez

The Ruahine Ramblez teams gave everyone a very special gift by taking part in the Dannevirke Christmas parade. It warmed my heart watching the faces of our children and residents enjoying watching these young people march with military precision and formation in their fantastic uniforms, leading the parade.

It was a real treat and made our parade one of the best yet. They created many new marching supporters at the parade, and I am sure exposed a whole new generation to the sport of marching.



4 – Young Elected Members Conference (YEM).

The YEM was held in Lower Hutt this year. It was a great conference which covered Te Reo Māori in council what we can do and ways we can implement this into council.

Climate change and declaring a climate emergency within our community.

A talk from Stuart Crosby about bringing YEM and local government closer together.

Jenna from Cabix did a very interesting session about media and how to deal with them and the types of questions they tend to ask. Along with how to manage negative issues and informing media about news items in our communities.

On the Friday night we were treated to a talk from Ashley Bloomfield. Ashley is a genuinely nice guy. He talked about being in a back-packer hostel in Christchurch not being able to sleep, pondering over when we needed to shut the country down.

Ashley's father is from Onga Onga and he attended Dannevirke high school. He was in the hostel.

6 - Te Ahu a Tūranga - Manawatū Tararua Highway

Tararua District Council, Palmerston North City Council and Manawatu District Council joined the team from Waka Kotahi for a site visit of the planned route of Te Ahu a Turanga – Manawatu Tararua Highway. Dr Mark Long shared the story of the waka which sits inside the site office located at the entrance of the Manawatu Gorge. This site office will be open for the public to visit and learn more about the project. This office will house 95 staff and a strong team of 350 roading construction staff will spend 3.5m hours to build the new road on it with 200 machines and has a target of 60% local employment



This is a roading project in a special and unique environment. Over 2m plants and trees will be planted including 27km of streams. It includes 300ha of pest control on top of these plantings. 100 ha has been added to the Manawatu Reserve.

The Manawatu Gorge area is the most seismically active in New Zealand

Up to 2 million cubic metres of earth is to be dug out in massive cuttings, with the largest being 55 metres deep.

This road will be the largest roading project in New Zealand during construction and is planned to be completed by December 2024.

The new bridge and flyover that will take the road across the Manawatu River right beside the entrance to the Manawatu Gorge walk is 300 metres long and 27 metres wide. This bridge flyover will be unique in New Zealand and will be the widest and flattest deck 4 lane bridge ever constructed in New Zealand.

In 2021 and we are underway with machinery visible to those travelling the Saddle Road. This is the start of much prosperity and growth for Tararua and our time to flourish from these opportunities. Every time this road is mentioned in the media, our name is there. It is our hope that our identity grows throughout the country with this.





7 - Hūarahi Tūhono – Weber to Wimbleton

It was a busy day on the 15th December with the first sod being turned on Hūarahi Tūhono - Weber to Wimbleton. We were joined by MP Kieran McNulty and Catriona McKay from the Provincial Development Unit who both turned the soil alongside our Alliance Director David Geary and Mayor Tracey Collis.

Catriona handed the signed funding contract to Chief Executive Bryan Nicholson. This was a very special day for many of us at council and throughout the district that have championed this project and helped bring it to fruition. The project was named by council, community and iwi together and translates to the road that connects Weber to Wimbleton. Shaun Morgans and Trudi Riddell from the community will sit alongside iwi on the project board. We look forward to being able to keep the community and district informed and in touch with this project. We have social outcomes with both procurement and local employment. Chief Financial Officer Raj Suppiah really bought it home to us in his speech when he said “our entire roading budget for the district is between \$13million and \$14million. So to put it in perspective the \$14million funding we have received is a life-saver for us.

It means we can give the community what it wants” Well put Raj.

8 - Te Ahu a Tūranga – Sod Turning

Over 200 plants were planted to line the stream, the eastern bridge will cross with our local children to celebrate the turning of the first sod of Te Ahu a Tūranga: Manawatu Tararua Highway. It was very special to have the sod turning in Woodville with Hon Prime Minister Jacinda Adern, Waka Kotahi Chair Sir Brian Roche, Hon Michael Wood Minister of Transport present for the occasion. There was much media coverage which highlighted just how special this project is to us in Tararua and to the region. The best news is that the Manawatu Standard finally referred to it as Manawatū Tararua Highway.
