






# 2 - Dannevirke Fire Brigade: 25 Year Gold Star Presentation

# 6 - Gwen Fairbrother QSM - 1st March 2021

Gwen Fairbrother sadly passed away on 1st March 2021. Gwen's service was held under Covid Alert Level 2 on Friday 5th March 2021, with limited numbers able to attend and many of her former students took to FaceBook to show their respect for Gwen as an inspiring teacher. The comments reflect the inspiration and support she gave individuals throughout their schooling life and in the community.

Gwen had a love of gardening and was the President of the Rose and Horticultural Society for 20 years. The society assisted with gardens in Dannevirke reflecting Gwen's passion for beautifying our town. In fact she was quoted "I have pleasure in endeavouring to make our community a more attractive place." A community Project we all drive by is at the northern end of town with the Welcome to Dannevirke signs and garden.

Gwen was passionate and involved in many organisations in Dannevirke. She cared deeply about the wellbeing of the Dannevirke Community and supported many projects. Her support included vehicles for the Cancer Society, the Health Shuttle, a water tanker for the fire brigade, buildings at the A&P Showgrounds, bus shelters and CCTV to make our streets safer. Gwen was Patron of the Dannevirke Brass Band and a passionate supporter of theirs.

Whilst she loved our community to look beautiful, she supported behind the scenes to ensure we were also safe and had access to essential services. From her support of the young with the Viking Playground to her care for those that needed large print books in our libraries, Gwen's generousity benefitted us all. In her civic nomination her unflagging dedication to provide care and attention to people in need was noted.

Her support for the town clock is well known and not by Gwen's choice – she noted to council staff that she did it because she wanted to, not to be acknowledged – her preference was that it was anonymous. Her stipulation was that it was made in Dannevirke.

Gwen was awarded a Tararua District Civic Honour in 2005 and a Queens Service Medal in 2011 for services to the community. Gwen's words on receiving these to Mayor Maureen Reynolds were: "I don't do these things to receive honour, I do them because I enjoy them".

Gwen was a very generous lady with her skills and her time. There are many good deeds known and as many unsung. I popped in to Eileen Mary to meet with Gwen and keep her updated with what was happening in council and the community – her interest in our people and our place never waned.

Gwen was proud of Dannevirke – the place she called home. "To live in the hearts we leave behind is not to die" and Dannevirke was family.
