- c. Combine consultation with the District Strategy process or Annual Plan 2022/2023 process, whichever is the best solution.
- d. Adjust the Housing Strategy to reflect the District Strategy, should that be necessary.
- e. Ensure finalised Housing Strategy actions are confirmed where necessary in the Annual Plan (or Long Term Plan) process to reflect the resources actually possible in the short-term.
- f. Undertake financial modelling for more pensioner units over the next few months, with a separate workshop discussion that leads to the 2022/2023 Annual Plan process.

And that Council note progress has been made through to stage 2 of the Infrastructure Acceleration Fund for the potential development of two identified areas in Pahiatua South and the former Pahiatua Hillcrest School site for development of new housing and infrastructure investment.

11.5 **Staff Report**

11.5.1 Mangaone Valley Road

11.5.1.1 Mangaone Valley Road is now open to one lane light vehicles, with the intention to extend that capability to other vehicles as soon as practicable.

11.5.2 **Dannevirke Water Supply**

11.5.2.1 Initial repairs have been completed to the liner of the Dannevirke impounded water supply, with a further leak identified requiring attention to rectify the loss of water.

11.5.3 **Covid-19**

- 11.5.3.1 Tararua Alliance staff have been working with local iwi and arranged for a mobile vaccine centre to come to the Oringi business park over the coming weeks to assist with vaccinating staff for Covid-19.
- 11.5.3.2 Congratulations are conveyed to them on that initiative, noting that every effort needs to be made to encourage and coordinate arrangements to enable all members of the community to get vaccinated.
- 11.5.3.3 This is particularly important given Tararua District is at the bottom of MidCentral District Health Board statistics for vaccination rates in its area.
- 11.5.3.4 There is a need to provide pop up mobile vaccination clinics in outlying rural areas to vaccinate residents who may otherwise find it difficult to get to a medical centre during the week.
