1. Recommendation

- 1.1 *That the report from the Manager - Democracy Services dated 30 May 2024 concerning the Hearing of Submissions - draft Long Term Plan 2024-34 be received.*
- 1.2 *That the Finance and Performance Committee provide direction to officers on matters to be considered at the Finance and Performance Committee meeting scheduled for 19 July 2024 as follows:*

2. Reason for the Report

- 2.1 To provide the Finance and Performance Committee with a copy of all the submissions received in relation to the draft Long Term Plan 2024-34 and a schedule of the submitters who wish to present their views to the committee in person.

3. Background

- 3.1 The formal consultation period on the draft Long Term Plan 2024-34 took place from 1 May 2024 to 31 May 2024.

- 3.2 A total of 499 submissions were received. Each submission was shared with the elected members as it was received to enable sufficient time for submissions to be read.
- 3.3 Of the 499 submissions, 39 submitters asked to present their views to Council in person. Some have subsequently withdrawn their request to speak.
- 3.4 The schedule of speakers is appended to this report.

4. Discussion and Options

- 4.1 Hearings are an opportunity for those who have provided feedback on the draft Long Term Plan 2024-34 to present their views to Council in person, and for the Council to ask questions and seek clarification from submitters on the matters raised.
- 4.2 However no options are considered, decisions made or discussions entered into during the hearings stage of the process.
- 4.3 The views presented to the Council via both written and verbal submissions need to be received by the Council with an open mind, and given due consideration when Council comes to the next step of the process.
- 4.4 At the completion of the hearing, the committee is asked to provide direction to officers on matters to be considered at the Finance and Performance Committee meeting scheduled for 19 June 2024, where matters raised in the submissions will be deliberated upon and given consideration.
- 4.5 Following the 19 June 2024 committee meeting, any changes to the proposed Long Term Plan agreed to by the committee will be made and the final version of the Long Term Plan brought to Council for adoption on 31 July 2024.

5. Statutory Requirements

- 5.1 Section 93 of the Local Government Act 2002 sets out requirements for the Council to follow in preparing and adopting a Long Term Plan for each financial year.
- 5.2 Section 82 of the Local Government Act 2002 sets out the principles of consultation. These are set out below, in the following Principles of Consultation:
- (1) Consultation that a local authority undertakes in relation to any decision or other matter must be undertaken, subject to subsections (3) to (5), in accordance with the following principles:
- (a) that persons who will or may be affected by, or have an interest in, the decision or matter should be provided by the local authority with reasonable access to relevant information in a manner and format that is appropriate to the preferences and needs of those persons:

- (b) that persons who will or may be affected by, or have an interest in, the decision or matter should be encouraged by the local authority to present their views to the local authority:
- (c) that persons who are invited or encouraged to present their views to the local authority should be given clear information by the local authority concerning the purpose of the consultation and the scope of the decisions to be taken following the consideration of views presented:
- (d) that persons who wish to have their views on the decision or matter considered by the local authority should be provided by the local authority with a reasonable opportunity to present those views to the local authority in a manner and format that is appropriate to the preferences and needs of those persons:
- (e) that the views presented to the local authority should be received by the local authority with an open mind and should be given by the local authority, in making a decision, due consideration:
- (f) that persons who present views to the local authority should have access to a clear record or description of relevant decisions made by the local authority and explanatory material relating to the decisions, which may include, for example, reports relating to the matter that were considered before the decisions were made.

(2) A local authority must ensure that it has in place processes for consulting with Māori in accordance with subsection (1).

6. Community Engagement and Consultation

6.1 During the consultation period, the Council provided a range of opportunities for people to have their say. These included community meetings, online feedback forms, publication of feedback forms in the Bush Telegraph newspaper, and feedback forms distributed with the consultation document.

meeting scheduled for 19 June 2024, where matters raised in the submissions will be deliberated upon and given consideration.

- 7.5 Following the 19 June 2024 committee meeting, any changes to the proposed Long Term Plan agreed to by the committee will be made and the final version of the Long Term Plan brought to Council for adoption on 31 July 2024.
