#### 1. Recommendation

- 1.1 That the report from the Senior Financial Accountant dated 27 September 2024 concerning the Draft Annual Report for the year ending 30 June 2024 be received.
- 1.2 That the Tararua District Council receive the draft Annual Report for the year ended 30 June 2024.
- 1.3 That the Mayor and Chief Executive be delegated authority to make any minor changes requested by Audit New Zealand and to sign the Statement of Compliance and Responsibility that is contained within the Annual Report for the year ending 30 June 2024.

#### 2. Reason for the Report

2.1 To present the draft Annual Report for the year ending 30 June 2024 and detail the process required to adopt the Annual Report.

#### 3. Background

3.1 The Annual Report is prepared under section 98 of the Local Government Act 2002, and includes the provisions of schedule 10, part 3. It compares Tararua

District Council's actual performance against what was planned in the Annual Plan 2023-24.

- 3.2 The Annual Report outlines how Council has spent money collected from ratepayers, residents, financial institutions and government agencies and includes both financial and non-financial information.
- 3.3 As well as reporting against the Council's key activities, performance indicators in the 2021-31 Long Term Plan and subsequent Annual Plan 2023-24, the Annual Report also reports against the Revenue and Financing, Liability Management and Investment Policies.
- 3.4 The Annual Report (including audit opinion) must be completed and adopted within four months after the end of the financial year (31 October 2024). However, with the delayed adoption of Council's Long Term Plan 2024-2034 this deadline was extended to 31 December 2024 for the 2023-2024 Annual Report.

#### 4. Discussion and Options considered

- 4.1 The Annual Report is externally audited by Audit New Zealand, on behalf of the Auditor General as required by the Local Government Act 2002. The Annual Report is a key accountability document for the community.
- 4.2 Audit New Zealand are scheduled to commence the final audit of the Annual Report on 14 October 2024. An audit report will be prepared for inclusion in the Annual Report and is planned to be presented to Council for adoption prior to 18 December 2024.
- 4.3 An audited summary of the information contained in the Annual Report will also be publicly available after the annual report is adopted.
- 4.4 Subsequently since the presentation of Council's 12 Month Performance Report officers have received Council's Annual Residents Surveys Benchmarking Report for 2023/2024. This has been included as an attachment to this report.

#### 5. Significance Assessment

5.1 The Council's Significance and Engagement Policy is not triggered by matters discussed in this report. No stakeholder engagement is required.

#### 6. Statutory Requirements

- 6.1 Section 98 of the Local Government Act 2002 sets out the requirements for preparing and adopting the Annual Report.
- 6.2 The Annual Report (including the Audit opinion) must be completed and adopted, by resolution of Council, within four months after the end of the financial year to which it relates (31 October 2024).

#### 7. Delegations


7.1 Under Clause 32 of Schedule 7 of the Local Government Act 2002, the Council is not able to delegate the authority to adopt the Annual Report.

# search background





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## **Research Objectives**

The specific objectives of this research were:

- To understand residents' satisfaction with services and facilities provided by Councils across New Zealand.
- <sup>1</sup> To benchmark the key performance indicators against other Councils.

### Method

- Surveys were undertaken with 18 different Councils across New Zealand in 2023/24, including 15 District Councils and 3 City Councils.
- Respondents were selected at random from the Electoral Roll, ratepayers database and/or email contacts collected through previous years' surveys.
- The questionnaires were designed in consultation with Councils and were structured to provide a comprehensive set of measures relating to core activities, services and infrastructure, and to provide a wider perspective of performance. This includes assessment of reputation and knowledge of Council's activities.
- Post data collection, the samples were weighted to be exactly representative of key population demographics for each area based on the 2018 Census.
- At an aggregate level the surveys have an expected 95% confidence interval (margin of error) of between +/- 3.2% and +/-4.8%.


